Day-by-day itinerary Day 1: Tuesday 7th July 2026

Edgworth, Winterbourne House & Gardens, Hotel.

Depart Edgworth by comfortable coach, accompanied by your tour manager and horticultural expert David Hurrion.

Arrive at Winterbourne House & Gardens, a beautifully preserved Arts & Crafts estate set within seven acres of botanic-style gardens.

Explore the tranquil walled garden, Japanese bridge, vibrant herbaceous borders, and specialised plant collections.

Free time for lunch at the garden café, then continue to your hotel, the Best Western Southcrest Manor Hotel in the heart of Worcestershire for check-in. Welcome dinner served at the hotel this evening.

Day 2: Wednesday 8th July 2026

Moreton Hall Gardens, Spetchley Park, The Riverside Garden

Begin your day at Moreton Hall Gardens, a horticultural treasure renowned for its elegant design and panoramic views across the surrounding countryside. Stroll through a series of beautifully crafted terraces, water features, and intimate garden rooms. After free time for lunch, continue to Spetchley Park Gardens, a remarkable Victorian garden steeped in history. Here you will encounter a collection of rare shrubs and trees, sweeping borders, and lakes framed by woodland walks. Conclude the day with a visit to The Riverside Garden, a charming private garden with cottage planting and scenic river views. Return to the hotel for dinner.

Day 3: Thursday 9th July 2026

Arley Arboretum & Gardens, Coughton Court.

After breakfast, head to Arley Arboretum, home to one of the oldest arboreta in the UK, set over 30-acres on the banks of the River Severn. Home to over 300 species of rare and ancient trees, including Britain's longest Laburnum arch, enjoy avenues of specimen trees, seasonal herbaceous borders, a restored Italian garden, and peaceful woodland paths. Free time for lunch at the arboretum café nestled within the walled garden, or one of the picnic areas.

In the afternoon, visit Coughton Court (National Trust), an imposing Tudor house with deep Catholic ties and a rare double priest hole. The award-winning garden estate spans 25 acres and features a large walled garden, rose collections with over 200 varieties, and a peaceful riverside walk. Return to the hotel for dinner.

Day 4: Friday 10th July 2026

Stone House Cottage Garden & Nursery, Baddesley Clinton, Return to Edgworth. After breakfast check-out, we visit Stone House Cottage Garden, an atmospheric and intimate garden enclosed by turreted red-brick walls. Browse rare and unusual plants in the adjoining nursery. Free time for lunch then continue to Baddesley Clinton (National Trust), a moated medieval manor surrounded by beautiful gardens. The estate features a formal walled garden dating back to the early 18th century and adorned with flower borders and fruit trees, alongside a charming courtyard garden created in 1889. Explore the orchards, wildflower meadows, productive vegetable garden, and lakeside walks. Depart midafternoon for return travel to Edgworth,


