2.	Minutes of AGM held on 15th November, 2023: These minutes were accepted at the 2024 AGM as a true record. Proposed by Judith Rowle Seconded by Jo Southam
a)	Matters Arising: No matters arising were raised
3.	Chairman's Report: Jean welcomed everyone to the AGM where the business items are discussed first followed a Social Evening with potato pie supper and a quiz.
	Jean then listed the benefits of membership to our 170 members in 2024. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Monthly meetings with expert speakers from Young Designer of the Year 2023 to a speaker almost at the end of his career and others in between ➤ Free visit to RHS Harlow Carr ➤ Evening visit to a private garden in Croston ➤ 2 Day trips by coach ➤ 4-day Holiday to Somerset ➤ Working with the Parish Council to fund the planters in Edgworth and Chapeltown. ➤ Maintaining the Barlow and Tebay garden beds continues ➤ Suttons Seeds offer EDHS members 50% discount on seeds and 15% discount on plants
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Rejuvenation of the Stocks Memorial Garden in Chapeltown is now complete. Work began in 2018 with a professional survey of the site. Unfortunately, there was little progress after that due to various issues and then Covid restrictions but in 2022 work began in earnest. NTPC gained a lottery bid which paid for the felling of a large tree and crown pruning of another which opened up the site letting more light in. EDHS and NTPC jointly chose Judithe Harrison's design for a wildlife garden and Heritage Properties UK was chosen to do the hard landscaping including moving the ancient cross slightly. The site is now planted up and bird & bat boxes have been hung and seats have been re-sited. <p>A water butt and waste bin are still to be obtained.</p>

	<p>When the grant is exhausted the remaining costs are to be equally shared between EDHS and NTPC.</p> <p>Work is now complete and the site was officially opened in August. Chapeltown Residents' Association have agreed to maintain the site.</p>
	<p>Legacy Funded Projects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ £2,000 was again available for applicants to apply for an award to help finance a horticultural project which will benefit the local community ➤ Thank you to Lesley King for organising The Crafty Green Fingers Group. Unfortunately, this course was discontinued due to insufficient uptake
	<p>Show: Great show with more exhibitors and entries than 2023.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Tombola stall raised £160 (inc. Gift Aid) which was donated to Bowel Cancer, UK, a charity chosen by Lauren Dickenson who presented the trophies. ➤ More junior entries than last year ➤ The plant stall and café also did well. ➤ A small surplus was made on the show.
	<p>Thanks were given to:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The facilities team at the Barlow for their support throughout the year ➤ The stewards at the show for all their hard work on the day ➤ The committee for tireless efforts throughout the year ➤ Tony Murphy was presented with an RHS Recognition Award for his work as Show Secretary and his help in setting up the Barlow for our meetings ➤ Co-opted members Sue Matthews, Carol Murphy, Janet Faulkner, Gill Pegman and Judith Rowle were thanked for the help and support they had given to the committee in various ways ➤ The advertisers in the schedule whose payments covered the cost of the schedule
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 4-day holiday visiting the gardens of Cambridgeshire, based in Ely, is being considered and names were being listed to assess interest ➤ Suttons Seeds again offer members 50% discount on seeds & 15% on plants ➤ Mahers of Great Lever will go out of business by the end of this year so we lose the benefit of the discount they offered over the past few years
	<p>She ended by thanking everyone for coming adding a further plea for members to consider how they can help in some way.</p> <p>This is her last year as chairperson and she is hoping to find a replacement/understudy for next year.</p>
4.	<p>Treasurer's Report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The Treasurer had prepared <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Financial Report to 30.09.2024 (end financial year) (appendix 1) Annual Show Report to 30.09.2024 (appendix 2) Summary Report to 15.11.2024 (appendix 3) Investment Track from 12.03.2018 to 12.09.2024 (appendix 4) ➤ The Treasurer thanked Judith Rowle for Reviewing the Accounts and presented her with a bottle of wine to show the society's gratitude. ➤ Phil explained the progress of the Legacy from its inception in 2018 when

	<p>its value was around £46,000. Today's value is approximately the same despite having withdrawn £9,000 over the investment period.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The holiday lost £1,300 due to insufficient numbers. The Society covered the loss but that can't happen again. We need 30 names to make the trip viable. ➤ Number of people attending meetings has fallen since the pandemic, we used to get 70 – 80 people, now its more like 40. This results in our income reducing at a time when all our costs are rising. ➤ Subscriptions have had to be increased for 2025 as follows:- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • £ 7.00 individual member • £12.00 for a couple/family • Monthly Entry Fees - £2.00 Members £4.00 Visitors ➤ It is likely that entry fees will rise next year. ➤ PB thanked Sue Brohi for finding advertisers for the Show Schedule ➤ The kitchen Garden team sold more plants this year resulting in fewer plants being donated to the kitchen garden at the end of the show. ➤ The café was a great success ➤ The Show raised around £407.50
