The pass is signed 'in' and 'out' as a short term loan. ▪ Thank you to members who have supported these efforts in any way, without your input there would be no Society, so thank you. ▪ There are 170 members currently. We are a committee of 8 plus 2 loyal co-

	<p>opted helpers and we desperately need more help especially from willing people to help with the moving and lifting and routine organisation of the society.</p> <p>This year we have sadly lost David Spencer, his support and efforts will be greatly missed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Our 8 meetings have covered a number of topics including Japanese Hardy Plants, Cultivating apple trees, to the efforts to re-introduce sphagnum moss to Holcombe Moor and the potential benefits of capturing water and carbon on our moors. ▪ 2 excellent garden day visits to John's Garden at Ashwood Nursery and Scampston Walled Garden. Our evening visit was to Sarah and Lee McLaren's beautiful garden at Chadwick's Close Farm on Smithills Moor. ▪ The 4-day holiday was visiting the Gardens of Cambridgeshire staying in Ely. We visited Coton Manor, Shuttleworth Air Museum, Cambridge Botanical Gardens, Ramsey Abbey Walled Garden and the Mary Challis Garden. They were each awarded an RHS Recognition Award.
4.	Treasurer's Report:
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The Treasurer had prepared <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Financial Report to 30.09.2025 (end financial year) (appendix 1) Annual Show Report to 30.09.2025 (appendix 2) Summary Report to 15.11.2025 (appendix 3) A powerpoint to illustrate his Report ▪ The Treasurer thanked Judith Rowle for Reviewing the Accounts and presented her with a bottle of wine to show the society's gratitude. ▪ Judith has agreed to review the accounts again in 2026. ▪ Legacy – Each quarter showed gain until July but despite 2 withdrawals totalling £8,000 the investment remains close to the original £46,000. ▪ Since receiving the bequest in 2018 the Society has granted more than £14,000 to local horticultural causes. ▪ Subscriptions remain the same, as follows:- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> £ 7.00 individual member £12.00 for a couple/family ▪ Monthly Entry Fees remain unchanged at - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> £2.00 Members £4.00 Visitors ▪ The Show raised around £343.77 and donated an additional £330.00 to Fort Alice (proceeds from the tombola stall) ▪ The entry fee for the Show was increased from £2. to £3, and the schedule advertisements brought in a record £1405, plant stall raised £610 and the café £515. Despite this our outlay has also increased greatly, prize money has been increased and we had to pay more for the hire of the reading room to compensate the café staff. ▪ Income from subscriptions barely covers the loss from meetings and day trips, planned to break even, often are not full. The 4-day holiday has had to be subsidised recently. 2026 holiday will be costed on a sliding scale on the number of bookings 20+, 25+, and 30+ The more bookings we get the cheaper the price.

Entry charge increase is another consideration to be discussed. ▪ Jill Pegman thanked the committee for all that they do to keep the Society going.
